Leadership & Volunteering starts here...



At the end of our introductory, high impact Who Am I? day, young people will have the chance to volunteer to become heroes. This is where student leadership starts as they challenge themselves on a 3 day course to co-deliver the same experience that they had to their younger peers.

The Heroes Journey involves a young person joining Team Heroes, a group of students in their school who are committed to becoming good role models, 'heroes' to the younger students and within their educational community. As a team they will learn together and support each other to develop essential life skills.






The Heroes Foundation is an exciting new organisation which will provide our volunteer heroes with an infrastructure to support them and which will promote wider and more extensive opportunities as they go through and beyond school.

Through a variety of extended courses and experiences the Heroes Foundation will build on the initial humanutopia experience by sustaining and supporting both individual heroes and also teams of heroes in humanutopia partner schools.

Through participating in these experiences in their schools and communities and committing to a designated number of volunteering hours, heroes will unlock a variety of exciting opportunities to help them build a brighter future for themselves.

Sustainability through ongoing support

Now in it's second year running, our ongoing support programme ensures that the momentum of the key concepts from day one continues and that the heroes are fully supported in their goals.

We have three levels for our Ongoing Support Programme (OSP) which is designed to support schools in sustaining our impact and building an independent Student Leadership Programme. We offer our Bronze, Silver and Gold OSP to all schools who have trained Heroes and looking for extra support in keeping the momentum going. We have had the pleasure of working with 29 committed schools who have joined the programme to utilise their Heroes and run projects to enhance their students' Hope, Confidence, Happiness, Relationships and Employability. It's great to work with Heroes and staff that are passionate about helping others, sustaining our work and developing themselves throughout.





St Mary's Catholic Academy, Blackpool (BEBCMAT) - Gold

Katie first met with the lead, Phil, in July 2017 where they mapped out a plan for 2017/18 academic year. They have successfully worked through the OSP plan with Lead Heroes running four projects. The Icon group have been working with Year 7, running 1 hour workshops during PHSE where Heroes planned a workshop and worked through a rotation to meet all of Year 7. The Icon session were full of games, written and interactive activities to revisit our icons to support Year 7 in life at school. The Peer Mentoring group met with Year 7 on a fortnightly basis to complete our Peer Mentoring projects and offer any support to their mentee where required. Each Peer Mentor worked hard to support Year 7 by sharing their own experience of life at St Mary's Catholic Academy. Heroes have also been working alongside the Maths and English team supporting students with their homework and revision. All Heroes have taken the responsibility to work as independently as possible and use their strengths to guide Year 7 where they can. Phil is extremely passionate about our work and the Heroes programme which has made working there a great pleasure.

Gateacre School, Liverpool - Silver

Gateacre Lead Heroes are a very efficient and keen group of individuals who drive their team of Heroes in the best possible way. It has been great to see such an amazing group of Heroes do so much with the passion and determination they have. Mariam was passionate for Heroes to run our hu Peer Mentoring sessions and target the whole year group which they did to a high standard. Heroes have also been running a drama club for younger students at lunch time, creating a space for the students to go create independently on their lunch breaks. The Lead Heroes joined in with our 'Heroes Helping the Homeless' project for International Volunteering day, where they successfully collected unwanted clothing for the homeless in Liverpool. Going into the summer term Heroes have planned and delivered Icon sessions to Year 8 which allows for Heroes to revisit our programme and guide Year 8 into setting some targets for their new school year. Heroes were given their own little office, next to the canteen area, where they spend every lunch and break time offering an open door drop-in service to all students. The Heroes are a Dream Team that every school needs.

Roodend Primary School, Birmingham - Silver

Having supported Jon for a year sustaining our programme with Year 6 and 2, Katie first met with Year 6 Heroes in October 2017 where she ran a workshop to prepare them to become confident Peer Mentors. Since then Year 6 have regularly met with Year 2 and completed our Peer Mentoring activities. Once Heroes built positive relationships and shared their experiences with Year 2, they became confident enough to plan and deliver their own mini Icon sessions to them. Katie returned in March where she supported Heroes to plan interactive Icon sessions for Year 2 where they worked in groups of 4 on a weekly basis. Heroes at Roodend have become positive role models and independently supported Year 2 through life at Roodend Academy. Jon is a great Lead Teacher who supports Heroes in every which way he can.

Tavistock - Silver

Tavistock college is a school based in Devon where Heroes are keen to volunteer and support each other as much as possible. We have been working with three Lead Teachers there: Tristian, Sophie and Nick on three projects since April. Tristian has taken the Lead on a Year 6 transition project which involved preparing Heroes to be positive role models when representing Tavistock College during primary visits, parents evenings and Year 6 transition days. Sophie works closely alongside a group of Heroes who have taken on the role Peer Mentors for Year 7 students. Katie ran a short workshop to support Heroes in their 1:1 sessions with Year 7 to help them offer advice and guidance where they can in school. Nick oversees the group who run Icon workshops. The Icon group are revisiting the hu icons, reflecting on changes they have made, and changes they are still to make with Year 7. Each project is supported by two-five Sixth form students who have expressed an interest in supporting a Student Leadership Team as well as two Lead Heroes who are responsible for the administration and overall organisation of the Heroes team to be as independent as possible. All students and staff are so welcoming which gives us excitement for the next year or so to unfold.



"Our first meeting with Humanutopia was in November 2017 with a view to commissioning provision that addressed emotional Health and Wellbeing.
